NC History: 1984 Girls Basketball State Champs

In 1984, the Newark Catholic girls basketball team made history by winning the school's first and only state championship in girls basketball during the 9th annual state tournament. 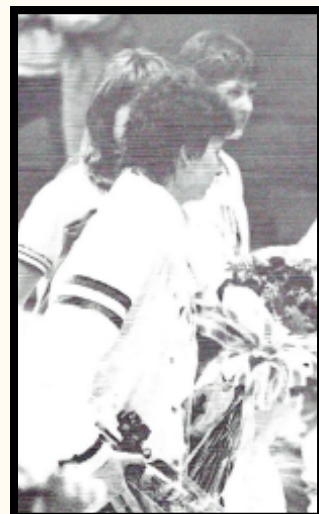

POPE FRANCIS

Pope Francis was born on December 17th, 1936 in Argentina. His full name is Jorge Mario Bergoglio. He grew up with his family of Italian immigrants. At 21, he joined the Society of Jesus and became an ordained priest in 1969. He studied philosophy and theology. He pursued a life committed to education and social justice. In 1998, he became the Archbishop of Buenos Aires. He was known for his humility and advocacy for the poor. He was appointed as a Cardinal by Pope John Paul II in 2001. In 2013 he was elected as the 266th Pope, taking the name Francis in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, who was dedicated to humility, peace, and care for others less fortunate.

Paul Revere's Ride

Paul Revere's Ride is a famous American story about the midnight ride of Paul Revere and two other messengers. Their ride took place during the American Revolution on April 18th, 1775. Stories have been passed down about Paul Revere's patriotism, and his role as the messenger who warned militias about advancing British troops. However he was not alone on this trip, as he was joined by William Dawes and Dr. Samuel Prescott. Dawes had taken a different route to the countryside and rode to Lexington with Revere to alert Samuel Adams and John Hancock. Paul Revere was captured by the British at 1:30am on April 19th. Dawes escaped by fleeing the British patrol but was thrown off his horse and had to walk back to Lexington. Prescott helped continue to spread the message to the town of Concord. This ride marked the beginning of armed conflict between the British forces and Colonial militia at the Battle of Lexington and Concord. Though the other two riders are often not talked about when Paul Revere is discussed, they played a crucial role in warning citizens about the attack. Dawes Arboretum in Newark, Ohio is actually named after William Dawes. His family founded it in honor of his role in the midnight ride and his contribution to the American Revolution.
